


# MEET THE MOUNTSBERG RABBITS




## FIND YOUR FOOD

### DID YOU KNOW?

- Rabbits and Hares are part of the same family but hares are usually larger than rabbits and have longer hind legs and ears.
- There are 5 species of rabbits and hares that live in Ontario: Eastern Cottontail, Arctic Hare, White Tailed Jackrabbit, Snowshoe Hare and European Hare.
- Rabbits are crepuscular, meaning they are most active at dawn and dusk.
- Rabbits are herbivores. They eat grass, dandelions and clover in the spring, and bark and twigs in the winter.
- Rabbits produce a green poop first and then eat that poop to get more of the nutrients they need from their food.
- Rabbits can dance! Male rabbits leap and kick to attract a girlfriend. Happy rabbits love to jump in the air!
- Rabbits make nests in a soft spot under shrubs and line their nest with their own hair from their chest and stomach.

Dwarf and Flemish Giant

**Life Span:**

5 to 8 years

**Diet:**

Pellets (made from hay, oats and grain), hay, fruits and vegetables

**Weight:**

1.5 to 4 lbs (Dwarf)

15 to 20lbs (Flemish Giant)
